## The Reverend's Reflection



This summer we have been exploring the ancient tradition of Creation Spirituality during worship. The ideas of creation spirituality are not new. They have been echoed by mystics for centuries. Some familiar forebearers are Irenaeus, Hildegard of Bingen, Julian of Norwich, Meister Eckhart and contemporary writer and theologian, Matthew Fox. Fox's 1983 book, Original Blessing has revitalized Creation Spirituality communities all over the world.

Creation Spirituality is based on the idea that everything is from God and the divine infuses all things. At its core is the theological concept of Panentheism which literally translated means, "all God." It's not that everything IS God (Pantheism) but that the divine permeates all creation.

When we see the world through the lens of Creation Spirituality we are compelled to care for the earth and for each other for we are all connected. The 13th century mystic Meister Eckhart, said, "Apprehend God in all things, for **God is in all things**. Every single creature is full of God and is a book about God. Every creature is a word of God. If I spent enough time with the tiniest creature - even a caterpillar - I would never have to prepare a sermon. So full of God is every creature." Next Sunday we will stare at caterpillars instead of listening to a sermon. I'm just kidding but his point is clear. God is alive in every part of creation, and it is our responsibility, our call to protect and nurture it all.

as freely as the rain falls, and be ever thankful.

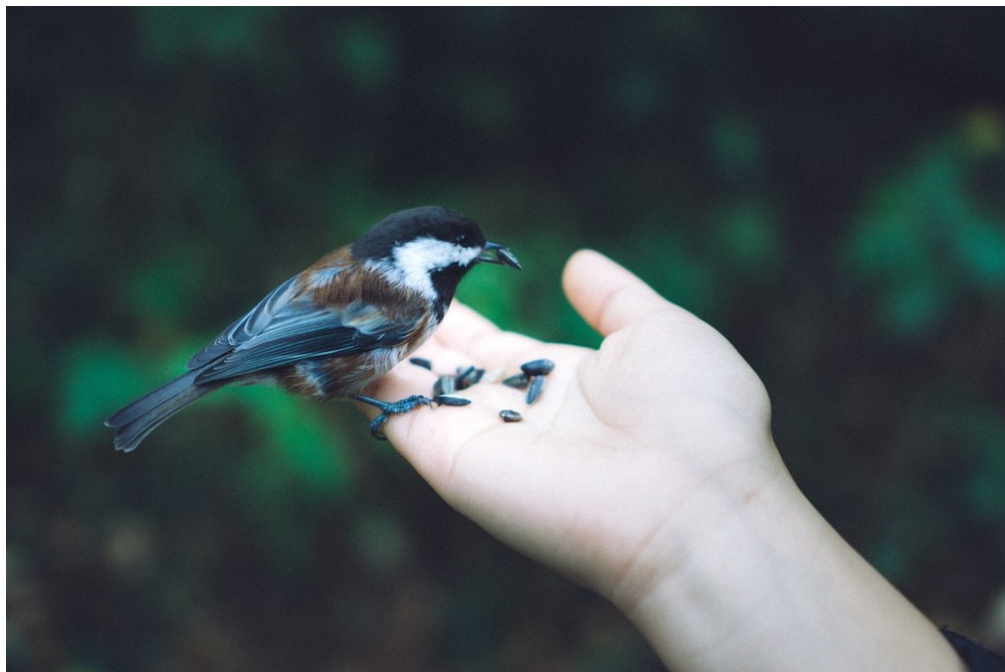
May we be radiant and natural and fragrant as flowers that flourish,

Next, as we look forward into the 2023 church year here at Hope UCC. ## Pastoral Relations Committee

Dear Members of Hope UCC,

The Pastoral Relations Committee has been meeting regularly with Rev. Karen in support of the new challenges that have been placed on her over the last two years. As you can imagine, our pastor's responsibilities have changed a bit and some priorities have shifted. When our church closed in 2020 due to the pandemic, a whole new way of worship presented itself to all of us. We discovered that Zoom allowed us to stay connected in various ways. The use of technology and AV equipment stretched the creativity of the pastor, our church committees and our members.

PRC thought that you would be interested in how Rev. Karen is "budgeting" her time each week at this point in time. Although she may not always be physically present at the church building, she continues to work to meet new expectations. The following is an hourly breakdown of how her time is allocated during a typical week. This is based on Rev. Karen's  $\frac{3}{4}$  time status as our settled pastor. The major shift in time is in increased time spent preparing for worship post-Covid.

Floating time to be used where and when the need arises

### Weekly Schedule (Sunday - Monday)

**Sunday- Monday:** Responsibilities as described above

**Friday:** Sabbath rest

**Saturday:** Day off

Notes:

\*PRC respectfully requests that the pastor's designated days off (Friday and Saturday) be respected. The pastor is, of course, always available for emergencies.

\* Hours that are not specified in the above sample are at the discretion of the pastor.

\*The above schedule is based on an average of hours committed to specific tasks that equal 30 hours per week. There will be weeks when more hours will be spent and times when fewer hours are spent.

\*\*This revision is meant to accommodate the pastor's hours post Covid-19, which has altered the "normal" routine of the church.
